

## Koret Foundation Commits \$2M to Support Bay Area Arts & Cultural Institutions

*Funding will go to local venues, museums and arts education programs,  
to help them reopen safely, welcome back audiences, and build out new technologies*

**SAN FRANCISCO** – The [Koret Foundation](#) today announced **\$2 million in new and planned grants** to fund key Bay Area arts and cultural institutions—including performance venues, museums and arts education programs—to support these pillars of the community as they re-open to live audiences after being shuttered throughout the pandemic.

These grants will focus on ensuring local institutions can **1.)** reopen safely and in accordance with public health measures; **2.)** welcome back audiences; and **3.)** help rebuild the region’s economy and restore its cultural vibrancy. Beneficiaries of the new grants include the following organizations:

“The arts sector has been one of the hardest hit by the pandemic, with the evaporation of in-person ticket revenue, and arts leaders have shown impressive resilience and creativity as they have managed through the crisis,” said [Michael Boskin](#), **president of the Koret Foundation**. “Now, it’s critical that we support our long-term grantees through the pandemic and beyond, to ensure that they’re not just able to survive, but to thrive, and to continue enriching our community for generations to come.”

As arts organizations navigate the uncertainty of re-opening, Koret’s funding will target three outcome areas: **a.)** key performances and exhibits, **b.)** technology infrastructure for hybrid in-person/remote events, and **c.)** arts education programs in local K-12 schools. These grants will provide flexible, responsive funding to serve as a bridge to a sustainable post-pandemic future for the local arts and culture scene. Altogether, this comprehensive approach will help strengthen the key pillars of arts and culture in the Bay Area.
